Whole School Counselor

Reports to the Head of School and Elementary and Secondary Principals Hanoi International School Mission:

As an employee of Hanoi International School, you support the growth and development of the students in line with the school's philosophy, as expressed in the Mission Statement and Values above.

As the Elementary Counselor, you are responsible for the following:

- Overseeing student pastoral care in the elementary and secondary divisions;
- Attends weekly elementary and secondary student support meetings, focusing on students of concern and the overall program;
- Counseling students one-on-one with social and emotional concerns;
- Supporting small groups of students with conflict- resolution and developing the socialemotional curriculum and delivery in the elementary and secondary school;
- Co-managing the elementary and secondary student monitoring systems;
- Working collaboratively with the student support team and leading a Universal Design for Learning (UDL) approach;
- Developing and teaching the secondary sexual health education program in the elementary and secondary;
- Writing Individual Educational Plans (IEP) for students with behavioral needs and communicating with teachers and monitoring progress, and use of the IEP;

• Meeting regularly with the Senior Educational Leadership Team (SELT).

Collegiality and Professionalism

As a staff member at Hanoi International School, you are responsible for the following:

- Promoting a culture of mutual respect and understanding;
- Exemplifying International-mindedness and participation in the wider IB and international community; promoting the positive image of Hanoi International School within the school and in the wider community;

As a staff member at Hanoi International School, you are responsible for:

- Demonstrating open communication with and between staff, students, and parents;
- Communicating with parents, ensuring that parents are kept adequately informed of student's progress (academic, social, and emotional);
- Representing the staff at PTA meetings when required and being willing to listen to and respond to parents' views;
- Maintaining strong and supportive communication lines between the secondary and elementary schools;
- Providing written documentation to external agencies, such as service providers for families and students.

- Model lifelong learning by remaining current with content and pedagogy in your area of academic responsibility;
- Foster respectful interactions among and with students and their peers, both in classrooms and the school;

- Promote the positive image of Hanoi International School in public settings;
- Take responsibility for the safety and discipline of students in and out of the classroom;
- Demonstrate diplomacy and discretion in all professional dealings;
- Take an active role in the Hanoi International School community;
- Cover additional teaching when required;
- Participate in the professional growth program, which encompasses teacher observation, appraisal, professional development, and professional goals;
- Participate in and lead committee work (IB and CIS) which contributes to achieving the school's strategic plan and mission;
- Perform any other reasonable duties requested by the Elementary Principal and Head of School.
